Sisters and Brothers,

Ontario remains a wealthy province inflicted with the disease of poverty.

While the provincial economy grows modestly, there is still more that the provincial government can do through public investment and tax reform to get more Ontarians working and to build a fairer society.

Today, roughly 370,000 children live in poverty, including almost four in 10 children of single mothers. Amongst some racilized communities that rate climbs to one out of every two children.

The pervasiveness of poverty is much greater than many might imagine. Consider that every day, one in seven Ontario children go to school hungry; one million workers earn minimum wage; one in five Ontarians have received help from a food bank or charity; and nearly half of all residents in the GTA and Hamilton are working in precarious, part-time and insecure employment.

Meanwhile, Canada's highest paid CEOs make 171 the average Canadian income. It is a contrast that is staggering.

In its landmark 2012 Report, "Falling Behind," the Ontario Common Front made headlines across the country when it exposed Ontario's shameful track record on fairness and equity, when measured by any index. Ontario ranks behind every other province in funding for virtually every social program and the equality gap was growing at an alarming rate.

This year, the Ontario Common Front will be putting the focus squarely on poverty and your support is needed to help mobilize a broad and diverse movement to pressure the Ontario government to commit to meaningful and immediate action to end poverty in all of its forms.

We are calling on your to join us from **April 17 to 18** to draft, develop and launch a "Solidarity Against Inequality" campaign at a province-wide Anti-Poverty Assembly in Toronto.
